Trösten Haus Holds Open House to Showcase Programming and Services



Birth to 3 Kiddos Receive Grant from Wisconsin Knights of Columbus



In January, the Wisconsin State Council Knights of Columbus approved a grant to Green Valley for \$1,700. The grant request was for the purchase of Therapeutic Listening Equipment™ and received approval from the Committee for Helping People with Intellectual Disabilities! Therapeutic Listening™ is one approach

used to treat listening difficulties; an approach which involves incorporating whole body treatment.

Therapeutic
Listening™ uses sound
training in
combination with
sensory integrative
treatment techniques
which emphasize

vestibular stimulation and postural movement strategies. The stimulation programs combine the therapeutic benefits of music with sophisticated sound technology. The sound stimulation used in Therapeutic Listening™ appears to set up the nervous system preparing ground for emergent skills.

A typical Therapeutic
Listening™ program may
be in place for two to six
months for initial gains,
however, many individuals
continue past this time
frame as part of an ongoing
sensory diet.
